- With our Funeral Services A.S. Degree, you gain the technical expertise and communication skills to become a licensed funeral director or embalmer in the state of Florida.
- To become a licensed funeral director and/or embalmer in Florida, you must pass both the Arts and Sciences sections of the National Board Examination, complete a one-year internship under the direction of a licensed funeral director and embalmer, and pass the Florida Law and Rules Exam.

- ☐ Submit official, unopened (sealed) high school or GED transcripts indicating completion of standard high school diploma or equivalency. **See *Transcripts/Transfer Credit**
If you completed an AAS degree or higher at a regionally accredited institution, SPC will not need your high school/GED transcript or Home School Affidavit.
- ☐ Submit official, unopened (sealed) transcripts from all regionally accredited college(s) and/or universities currently or previously attended (outside of St Petersburg College). **See *Transcripts/Transfer Credit**
- ☐ Students must demonstrate they are at college level in Writing and Reading, either through appropriate test scores or through appropriate course completion.

- ☐ **For purposes of GPA calculation when applying for selective admission to the Program, only the first attempt in FSE 1000 and FSE 2061 will be considered. Therefore, students who are unsuccessful in their first attempt in either of the Pre-Entry Funeral Support Courses (FSE 1000 or FSE 2061) are ineligible for program admission. – Starting Fall 2026 admissions cycle.**
- ☐ **Funeral Director License:** Applicants to the ABFSE-accredited Funeral Services A.S. Degree Program who are graduates of any non-accredited funeral services/arts program (e.g., Funeral Arts Certificate) must be licensed funeral directors prior to admission into the accredited degree program. Licensure is to be kept current and unrestricted throughout the duration of the program. *The Health Admission Application will provide the opportunity to input your required Funeral Director license information as you complete the application. – **Starting Fall 2026 admissions cycle.**

- **If you have submitted updated transcripts from one institution, please verify that your most recent coursework is evaluated and posted to your SPC record.**

***Alternative Satisfaction**

- Transfer courses for which there is no direct SPC equivalent will be posted as elective credit and designated with a number ending in "999"; additionally, upper division (300/3000 level or higher) transfer credits do not automatically post to your SPC record.
- All upper division coursework (transfer or SPC) does not automatically satisfy admission requirements; it must be requested by the student.

Note to students who plan to pursue the Funeral Services AS Degree after the Funeral Arts

Certificate: Applicants to the ABFSE-accredited Funeral Services A.S. Degree Program who are graduates of any non-accredited funeral services/arts program (e.g., Funeral Arts Certificate) must be licensed funeral directors to be accepted into the accredited degree program. – **Starting Fall 2026 admissions cycle.**

***Transfer Credit Policy:**

Non-Funeral Services credits (for example, general education courses) may be accepted only if they are earned from a regionally accredited institution.

Only credits earned in Funeral Services programs within the State of Florida that are accredited by the ABFSE will be considered for transfer toward the major.

Students must achieve a score of 75% or higher on the subject matter exam for each Funeral Service course they seek to transfer to receive transfer credit. Only one attempt is permitted.

FSE 1000 and FSE 2061 are weighted heavily for admission purposes. Only the first attempt in these courses will be used in selective admissions GPA calculations.

Selection Criteria

Due to enrollment limitations, meeting minimum requirements does not guarantee admission. When the number of eligible applications exceeds program availability, selective criteria is used to determine which applicants are offered admission. This criterion is based on a point system using health program GPA, and completion of pre-entry, general education and support coursework, according to the following:

- **40 points** may be awarded based on the GPA from the following courses: **FSE 1000, FSE 2061, BSC 2085 and BSC 2085L, and ACG 2021.** (Minimum 2.5 GPA required for consideration)
- A grade of P will be assigned the value of a student's cumulative GPA for selective admission GPA calculation purposes for this program, excluding the computer competency.

All application requirements must be satisfied by the close of the application window.

Admissions Information

Admission status notifications will be sent through MySPC live student email (xxxxxx#@live.spcollege.edu). If you are not sure how to access your SPC student email, please visit [How do I Access My SPC Email](#).

If you are offered admission you will need to complete the following pre-enrollment requirements by a specific due date to maintain eligible status:

- Complete the Notice of Intent survey (Provided in Admission E-Mail)
- Successfully pass a [background screening](#). (Information and due date provided in Admission E-Mail)
- Complete the Health Education and Program orientation. (Information and due date provided in Admission E-Mail)

Candidates on the Alternate list must follow instructions and deadlines in their notification to maintain eligibility for possible admission. If you are not moved from alternate to admitted, you will need to reapply during the next appropriate application period.

If you are not offered admission, you will need to reapply during the next appropriate application acceptance period.

SPECIAL PROGRESS REQUIREMENTS

- Students transferring FSE courses from another ABFSE-accredited institution must pass the final exam for the course(s) they wish to transfer.
- Students must register for and successfully complete at least six credit hours per semester (excluding summer sessions and the final semester). Arts courses are offered year-round; science courses are offered Fall and Spring semesters only.
- Failure to enroll in and successfully complete 6 credits of FSE classes for more than two consecutive semesters will result in dismissal from the program, requiring application for re-admission.
- All clinical students, including those enrolled in distance embalming or restorative art labs, are required to attend the first scheduled embalming and/or restorative art lab meeting on campus. Distance clinical students must also attend at least one additional lab session on campus to demonstrate competency in their skills. Students participating in off-campus clinical instruction must complete the clinical site application process prior to beginning their assignments.

On-Campus Requirements and Distance Learning Disclosure:

ON-CAMPUS REQUIREMENTS

Funeral Service laboratory courses require on-campus attendance.

Students must be available on scheduled lab days and times as published in the course schedule each semester.

Laboratory courses typically meet as follows:

- FSE 2101L – Embalming I Lab: Thursdays, 9:00 a.m. – 12:00 p.m.
- FSE 2141L – Restorative Art Lab: Tuesdays, 1:00 p.m. – 3:00 p.m.
- FSE 2120L – Embalming II Lab: Tuesdays, 9:00 a.m. – 12:00 p.m.

**Laboratory sessions may occasionally extend beyond scheduled times due to the complexity and unique requirements of specific embalming or restorative arts cases.*

All Funeral Services courses, except labs, are delivered exclusively online.

General Education courses may be completed either online or in person. Some support courses are offered only online (HSC 1524, FSE 1000, and FSE 2061).

Travel Responsibility Notice: Students are responsible for all travel-related expenses associated with on-campus requirements. These costs may include, but are not limited to, fuel, transportation, lodging, and meals.

DISTANCE LEARNING DISCLOSURE

In limited circumstances, distance options may be available for certain laboratory requirements.

To be eligible, students must meet specific grade and state registration requirements as outlined by the program.

*Students must obtain Program approval in advance of enrollment, and distance options are not guaranteed.

GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS

To be licensed in Florida as a funeral director and/or embalmer, students must:

1. Successfully complete the Funeral Services AS Program.
2. Pass the Arts and Sciences Sections of the National Board Examination (NBE).
3. Complete a one-year internship under a licensed funeral director and embalmer.
4. Pass the Florida State Laws and rules exam.

Timely graduation is required for accreditation compliance. Students who do not maintain steady progress jeopardize both program standing and their own eventual licensure.

AS Program Dismissal Policy:

Students enrolled in the AS Program who accumulate more than two unsuccessful attempts (grades of D, F, W, or WF) in *any* FSE courses will be dismissed from the program without eligibility for readmission (WR is not included in attempts).

***ENHANCED WORLD VIEW:** Complete at least one 3-credit course intended to enhance the student's world view considering an increasingly globalized economy.

This course may also be used to satisfy another General Education Requirement (Humanities and Fine Arts)

****CIVIC LITERACY:**

Students entering an A.S. Degree program in the 2022-2023 academic school year, or thereafter, must demonstrate competency through successful completion the Civic Literacy requirement.

This may include a course and exam, or an alternative accelerated mechanism.
