- Submit official, unopened (sealed) high school or GED transcripts indicating completion of standard high school diploma or equivalency. We do not accept unofficial copies or official copies that have been opened. Applicants who have earned an Associate in Arts, Associate in Science, Associate in Applied Science, Baccalaureate, or higher degree from a regionally accredited institution are waived from this requirement. **Transcripts must be received and evaluated by St. Petersburg College prior to the application deadline to ensure consideration.** [Submitting Official Transcripts](#)
- Submit official, unopened (sealed) transcripts from all regionally accredited college(s) and/or universities currently or previously attended. We do not accept unofficial copies or official copies that have been opened. **Transcripts must be received and evaluated by St. Petersburg College prior to the application deadline to ensure consideration.** [Submitting Official Transcripts](#)
- Students must demonstrate they are at college level in Writing, Reading, and Math either through appropriate test scores or through appropriate course completion.
- Students must have a cumulative grade point average of 2.00 on a 4.00 scale in all postsecondary coursework. Academic Standing may have an impact on admission, enrollment, and financial aid eligibility. See the SPC Academic Standing Policy for details. [Academic Standing Policy](#)

- Complete **CGS 1100**, Computer Applications; **HSC 1531**, Medical Terminology; and **BSC 1084C**, Essentials of Human Anatomy & Physiology (or BSC 2085 and BSC 2085L, Human Anatomy & Physiology I and Lab, and BSC 2086 and BSC 2086L, Human Anatomy & Physiology II and Lab) **with grades of “C” or better.**

 - Participate in the Health Education Program orientation on the date indicated in the admission email.

Transfer Coursework

Transfer courses for which there is no direct SPC equivalent will be posted as elective credit and designated with a '999' course number. Experiential Learning Program (ELP)

Learners are able to use the [Experiential Learning Program](#) (ELP) to waive credits or to test out of classes in which they have experience. The ELP program does incur a small fee for each credit hour awarded and credit is awarded based on the evaluation of the assigned assessor.

Here are the instructions to initiate this process:

1. Identify specific courses you would like to earn credit for. (NOTE: Some HEC courses are not eligible for ELP credit.) Review your degree progress report in MySPC and/or contact an academic advisor to clarify your program requirements.
2. Complete the ELP application at <https://web.spcollege.edu/survey/3077>
3. A designated SPC instructor will interview you to determine if an assessment will be performed.
4. Submit any required documentation for the assessment and pay the ELP fee of \$25 per credit hour.
5. The instructor evaluates the materials and determines if credit will be awarded.
6. A notification is sent to you of the assessment outcome.
