PRESENTATION OF RETIREMENT RESOLUTIONS

The Board adopted a retirement resolution for Dr. Shri Goyal, Dean of the College of Technology & Management. Dr. Goyal was in attendance and, joined by colleagues and family, received his resolution as presented by Chairman Brett and President Law.

ANNUAL ORGANIZATIONAL MEETING

The annual organizational meeting took place, with the election of Mr. Kenneth P. Burke as chairman and Mr. Terrence E. Brett as vice chairman for FY 2010-11. The Board further voted to continue holding its regular and special meetings on the third Tuesday of each month at 8:30 a.m. in the EpiCenter Conference Room, unless otherwise designated and agreed upon. All meeting dates/time/locations are subject to change upon Board vote. Mr. Brett was thanked for his leadership in chairing the Board through FY 2009-10.

OLD BUSINESS

The Board received a follow-up report on the College Reach-Out Program (CROP), which included highlights and organizational structure. In addition, Dr. Doug Duncan, Senior Vice President of Administrative/Business Services & Information Technology, presented a summary of the new Student Textbook Voucher Plan and reviewed answers to anticipated frequently asked questions.

President Law presented an update on FY 2010-11 and FY 2011-12 State Budgeting, specifically addressing reduction strategies and seeking trustee guidance as to what values they feel are important in honing the new budget to meet the target reduction.

NATIONAL LEADERSHIP OPPORTUNITY

The Board offered its full support of an opportunity for SPC to participate in a pilot study for the New Leadership Alliance for Student Learning and Accountability, whereby, the College would assist in identifying and implementing a "certification" process that would allow colleges and universities to demonstrate their commitment to improved learning and effectiveness and address the growing national involvement in changing accreditation guidelines.
