Biometric Screenings

Our Biometric Screenings are short, confidential tests that check for certain conditions by testing your cholesterol and glucose levels as well as measuring blood pressure and body mass index (BMI). Screenings take 15-20 minutes.

*Fasting is not required.

*Employees are limited to 1 biometric screening per calendar year.

For example, if you participated in an on campus biometric screening event in 2015, you would not participate in another screening until 2016.







Adjunct Expense Tracking to Budget




