Welcome/Introductions	Minutes for October 21, 2009 to be presented at the January 20, 2010 meeting	Introductions completed. Review of minutes approved.
Internship Program	The new Internship Coordinator was introduced – Susan Biszewski-Eber. Co-op/work experience programs have been eliminated. Guidelines for Internships were presented. It was recommended that the employer get a copy of the objectives that are established between the instructor and student. Non-profit opportunities will be available as well. It was recommended that the final internship report be made available to the employer. A student will be required to complete 60 hours for each credit earned. Members questioned whether a student may split up the number of credits if they do not start at the beginning of a semester.	The process is still in draft form and will be reviewed by faculty and the advisory committee for approval.  Check with the curriculum office to see if students can split up the internship credits.
Internship Program (cont.)	Members felt that eight week internships are not worth their time and two semesters would be better. It is recommended that the student be paid for the position either hourly or with a stipend. It was noted that international students are not allowed to work for pay..	None noted

It was asked if we offer testing for the certifications.</p> <p>Roberto Fernandez is working to establish an International Studies program with travel to Ecuador.</p>	BT department is looking at reestablishing a testing center for SPC students only and using lab fees to pay for the certification exams for the students.
