VIII.

State of ADN Program-G. Burt

Enrollment: 685 students

219 students are expected to graduate in May 2010. Fifty-two of those students are readmits. Student nurses may not be able to graduate due to lack of preceptors at the hospitals/facilities while in their last course, Nursing Care Management (NCM). Those 52 students have been notified they may not be able to complete NCM until the summer

<u>Faculty</u>: 34 Full Time Budgeted Faculty, 9 Partner Faculty through BayCare, Largo Medical, Northside, Bay Pines VA and Morton Plant Mease Earn as You Learn. There are 15 Percent of Load Faculty for a total of 58 Faculty members. <u>Curriculum</u>: The Faculty are currently reviewing the curriculum by either revising or updating its content. Recruitment: Our Advising Department is providing information to students earlier to help them become more eligible to enter the program.

Partnerships are strong.

Master Rotation and Clinical Placements: There are now 29 schools that come to the Master Rotation meeting. It is very difficult to place students in OB and Peds.

Hillsborough County is no longer writing new contracts for schools. After HB 1209, the Board of Nurssing has approved 20 new pre-licensure Nursing Programs in Florida. Hospitals are finding they cannot accommodate so many students.

Equipment: In order to purchase equipment, we need to have the Advisory Board's approval if the amount of the item is over \$1,000. We were informed the Perkins grant has money for equipment in the ADN Program. Those items needed are a Sim Medi-Dose and several Vital Sims Low Fidelity Simulators.

<u>Graduate Survey-Evaluation-Job Placement-Student</u> <u>Outcomes-Learning Outcomes-ATI/End of Program</u> <u>Outcomes-Dr. Wittman</u> (see attached)

The ADN Program is getting ready for accreditation in the spring of 2012. The NLNAC Systematic Plan has a completely new format and ours is being reformatted. Graduate survey: The response rate from employers was only a 16-27% return rate.

Survey of Employers response rate was only 15-19% return rate.

<u>Job Placement Report</u>: This percentage rate will decrease as graduates are having problems finding employment during this economic slow down impacting hiring of our graduates.

Total Outcomes for Entering Nursing I classes with a 4 semester benchmark in Fall 2007 shows 80% of the students graduated, 10% withdrew and 4% still working on their ADN. For LPNs the percentage who graduated was 80%, 17% withdrawn and 3% still working on their ADN. Major Learning Outcomes: This shows the completion rate per semester per level. Nursing I, II and II level students in 2009 show the percentage rates of passing the courses between 96-100%, however, when it comes to the Nursing IV level only 79% passed. This is very problematic to us. ATI Predictor/End of Program: In the Fall of 2009 only 62% passed on the first attempt.

Dr. Wortock will send the Committee the "glitch" bill HB 1337 which is to fix some of the challenges from last year's HB 1209. This bill is important to the state of Nursing and Health Care in Florida. The Senate Companion bill is SB 2530.

Recommendation:

It was motioned to accept the items the Perkins Grant will purchase for the ADN Program. All Committee members agreed on this purchase as well as other items over \$1,000. Motion passed.

Responses on the Graduate and Employer survey is extremely important to us and for our accreditation. Employers may need to send the Evaluation out to their Nurse Educators to get a better response since they know which of our graduates are on their unit. Please read the Lichert Scale correctly (1=the worst rating and 5=the best rating. The Evaluation Committee will be meeting on the return rates at a future date.

NCLEX Pass Rates: 83% of the students passed in 2008-2009. We would like pass rates higher, of course. The State Pass Rate is 88%.

How are students getting into their last session of Nursing (Nursing IV) and not able to pass these comprehensive exams? This data is telling us we do not have enough complexity in Nursing I, II or III. We are now looking at Curriculum changes to increase complexity at the earlier levels. Some Committee members felt that a high GPA does not necessarily mean a good nurse and a Committee may need to look at other alternative requirements. A Task Force to look at the Nursing Selective Admissions requirements was requested by the Committee.

IX.

Status of RN-BSN Program-Dr. Wortock

Enrollment: 613 students

With the increasing number of students, we have needed to increase the capacity in classrooms 209 from 36 to 44. With this increase, we will need to purchase new laptops student use. This equipment needs approval from the Advisory Board.

Faculty: 8 Full Time Faculty

Dr. Wortock is writing in her Budget for next year to request a ninth Full Time Faculty member since there were 29 sections of classes needing to be covered by Adjunct Faculty this spring.

Recruitment: We are continuing our recruitment efforts. Dr. Delgato, Director of Curriculum and Student Success and T. Kontodiakos, Recruiter, were at Pasco Hernando Community College last week and distributed over 200 brochures on our RN-BSN Program within the first 30 minutes

Graduation Rates: Dr. Delgato shared the results of our two year and five year graduation Benchmark. Our two year mark is 51.2%. The threshhold for our five year graduation rate has been set at 70%. Our five year graduation rate is 73.6%. Dr. Delgato and A. Rowe, Baccalaureate Specialist, are targeting those students who have not completed our program for special guidance. Our program is designed to graduate students within five semesters, however, those students who have not graduated within that time line have been identified as those student who have not completed their general education requirements or their upper division Nursing classes. An alternative program plan has been designed. The program will be offered in additional sessions. For instance, instead of taking the first three courses (Professional Roles, Pathophysiology and Pharmacology) that is designed for the five semester graduate who has their general education requirements completed, their student will take Professional Roles the first semester with two general education courses. Then the next semester they will take the next course, Pathophysiology along with general education courses and so on.

Dr. Wortock has been contacted by schools around the country to look at our program as a model, i.e., Washington State, California, Michigan, etc. IOM just contacted her on the impact our new model has had and what the future will bring.

Recommendation:

G. Johnson motioned to have an Admissions Task Force. Motion passed. G. Johnson and A. Locsin volunteered to sit on this Admissions Task Force.

Since graduates are finding it hard to find employment, they are choosing to enroll into our RN-BSN program directly after completing the ADN Program. They are admitted provisionally for one session while waiting to ist for their RN boards. If they do not pass their boards, they cannot continue in our Program until they are successful. XIII. Old Business NCLEX Exam Beginning April 1, 2010 the NCLEX exam will increase in complexity. The passing standard is changing from -0.21 to 0.16 logit (mathematical unit of measure). Questions will increase up to 22% in manager of care and decrease in basic care. There will be alternate format items such as select all that apply, fill in the blank, chart exhibit questions. XV.
