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| <p>AGENCY ROUNDTABLE/UPDATES</p> | <p><i>Lauralynn Seguar – Eckerd Community Alternatives</i> - ECA serves 3,000 children; approx. 70-80 children are removed from their homes per month. #1 cause: Substance Abuse; #2 cause: Domestic Violence.</p> <p><i>Rhonda Russick – St. Petersburg Free Clinic</i> – provided updates on Free Clinic Services.</p> <p><i>Astrid Ellis – Healthy Start</i> – Pinellas County has the highest death rate of neonates dying from substance exposure.</p> <p>A grant has been approved for a new program. Staff has been hired and starting training. The program is evidence-based and works with substance-abusing mothers. It includes home visiting. There is a special team of Care Coordinators (PAT Plus) – Parents as Teachers curriculum. HS has contracted with PAR. Patty Nagle is the Director of this program.</p> <p><i>Diane Clarke, Operation PAR</i> – Two new positions funded by JWB to work with neonatal units at ACH and Mease Countryside Hospitals.</p> <p><i>Donna Sicilian – Pinellas County Schools</i> – *There has been a decrease in the number of BSW students at USF. They are increasing the number of MSW students. *Bring a BSW program to SPC? Need to get support from employers for Bachelors degree program.</p> <p><i>Kathleen Griffin – RCS – Interim Director</i> – Director Position in available.
