<b>REVIEW OF LABOR MARKET DATA</b>	<p>Occupation Overview Report and Percentile Earnings Report was provided by Kristin Dailey of CareerSource Pinellas.</p> <p>The Committee reviewed the report and had a brief discussion. No concerns noted.</p>	<p>None</p>
<b>OLD BUSINESS</b>	<p><b><u>SPC Titan Collegiate Exchange Club</u></b></p> <p>The former Human Services Organization is now called the SPC Titan Collegiate Exchange Club. The Burg Exchange Club (part of the Northeast Exchange Club) has asked SPC to be the first organization sponsored by them. They will help organize the SPC club. There are 40 students already signed up.</p> <p><b><u>Curriculum Changes:</u></b> The new 60 credit degree program (with the 4 subplans) is effective this semester (fall). Student transcripts are being reviewed and those for whom it makes most sense and is in their best interest are being switched to the new degree/curriculum.</p>	<p>The Advisory Committee will be kept up to date on the Club's activities and events.</p> <p>Student graduation rates should increase and length of time to complete the program will decrease. <b>AGENCY ROUNDTABLE / UPDATES</b>	<p><b><u>Human Services Baccalaureate Degree:</u></b></p> <p>A new proposal for a Bachelor's degree in Human Services will be completed and presented in 2016-2017.</p> <p>Data has been gathered and discussions completed by employers, Advisory Committee members, students, and other stakeholders. There is broad support for this initiative.</p> <p><b><i>Mike Jalazo– PERC (Pinellas Ex-Offender Reentry Coalition)</i></b></p> <p>PERC is entering into a contract to start the Tampa Bay Career Pathways Collaborative at the Dr. David T. Welch Center for Progress and Community Development</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• \$3,000 per participant Focus is on manufacturing training (average age is 52-56) Launching this program next week</li> <li>• PERC is working with JDAI (a committee of the Dept. of JJ) on an evening reporting center</li> <li>• This is a pilot program with the county</li> <li>• They may have up to 10 youth at a time</li> <li>• Youth are picked up from school and then go to the Welch Center for Progress &amp; Community Development</li> <li>• PERC is working with the USFSP Family Studies Center and would like interns for tutoring</li> <li>• They have 2 passenger vans that were donated by the City of St. Petersburg</li> <li>• PERC has signed the contract and is awaiting the County signature and hope to begin this program in November.</li> <li>• PERC is working on “My Brother &amp; Sister’s Keeper”</li> <li>• Attempting to bring back the Stars/Strive Program</li> <li>• Starting in January, 2017</li> <li>• PERC purchased a 66 room hotel “Continental” for a transitional housing program</li> <li>• Location: US 19 &amp; Ulmerton Road</li> </ul>	<p>A proposal to start the process of developing a new Baccalaureate option will be completed and presented. <p><b>AGENCY ROUNDTABLE / UPDATES (Continued)</b></p>	<p><b>(PERC, Continued)</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Opened in June, 2016</li> <li>• Clients will receive treatment at the PERC office on Ulmerton Road (Clearwater) - just east of US 19.</li> <li>• Juan Otilene conducts the treatment courses at PERC</li> </ul> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• The 20<sup>th</sup> Annual Showcase of Services is scheduled for October 12, 2016 at PTC South from 9am-2:00pm.</li> <li>• There will be a job fair component</li> <li>• 400-500 ex-offenders and their families attend annually</li> </ul> <p><b>Denise Kerwin– SPC CE Health Department</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• The Guardianship Conference is scheduled for October 14<sup>th</sup> at the SPC EpiCenter. CEUs are available</li> <li>• SPC now offers a fast-track Clinical Medical Assistant Program <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- 16 week program now offered at out Midtown Campus</li> <li>- Students are required to complete an externship</li> <li>- Graduates become certified and licensed CMAs.</li> </ul> </li> <li>• SPC is beginning a phlebotomy program. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- 6 week program in Oldsmar. Will begin in November.</li> </ul> </li> <li>• If a student is already a CNA, they can take a fast track program to become a CMA (Clinical Medical Assistant) <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- Externship required</li> <li>- 100% job placement rate</li> </ul> </li> <li>• Expanding the Active Shooter Conferences for Healthcare Professionals. 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<p><b>AGENCY ROUNDTABLE / UPDATES (Continued)</b></p>	<p><b><i>Bon Secours (continued)</i></b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- They want to start a conversation regarding the intersection of population health and community housing</li> <li>• Bon Secours is partnering with the St. Petersburg Free Clinic Dental Clinic</li> <li>• BS is interested in the Community Health Worker Initiative</li> <li>• “Health Community Initiative”</li> <li>• Bon Secours does provide some funding for projects. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- They are a small funder and are open to new ideas</li> <li>- They would like to help set up programs to get up and running and then exit</li> </ul> </li> <li>• Grant Process: They have Fall and Spring Challenge Grants</li> <li>• Kip Corriveau is in charge of Community Benefit Work</li> <li>• One of the most important health outcomes indicators is your zip code.</li> </ul> <p><b><i>Susan Easter – St. Petersburg Free Clinic</i></b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• SPFC lost 15% of their patients after the Affordable Care Act. – they have since gained 50% of them back.</li> <li>- The Davis Bradley building (WestCare) has had issues getting residents to healthcare appointments. As a result, starting in September, 2016, the 1<sup>st</sup> off-site location for the SPFC will be located at the WestCare Davis Bradley building.</li> <li>• The SPFC has 130 volunteers with 8 people in the medical &amp; dental clinic</li> <li>• On September 15, 2016, the SPFC opened a new program at the main clinic – a new Cardiovascular Care Clinic. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- The Cardiovascular clinic is for low income/uninsured patients.</li> <li>- It is funded through an Allegany Franciscan Ministries grant</li> <li>- A Nurse Practitioner was hired for this program</li> <li>- St. Anthony’s/BayCare help to provide advanced care</li> <li>- The SPFC would like to make this program model their Diabetic Care Program</li> </ul> </li> <li>• The SPFC is on the Diabetes Summit. – The goal is to reduce the incidence of diabetes by 20% by 2020</li> </ul>	<p>Bon Secours fiscal year is September 1 – August 31 (for grant proposal submissions)</p> <p><a href="https://stpetersburgfreeclinic.org/">https://stpetersburgfreeclinic.org/</a></p>

- They received a grant from Florida Blue to provide dentures to clients.
- The SPFC has a free vision clinic and they provide free eye exams (9/17/2016)
- The SPFC completes free prostate cancer screening

***Joy Carta – SPC Gibbs Campus Internship Coordinator***

- Joy shared upcoming events at the SP Gibbs Campus
- We now have a career hub in the SA building (same building where the human services program is located)
- Events offered by the Internship office center around the new 10 SPC Academic Communities

***Douglas Bonar – A Center for Wellness***

- ACFW provides court-ordered 26 week group counseling sessions
- He has approximately 60 clients at any given time
- They now have a Spanish-speaking therapist for the Batter's Intervention program– Beatriz Mester-Allen
- Douglas is a local facilitator for Noetic Sciences
- Douglas Bonar has been elected to the National board of the Institute of Noetic Sciences (states of consciousness, psychic abilities, how do we save the earth?, etc.)
- They work with indigenous cultures and with environmental activism
- Douglas is also on the Sustainability Council

***Karin Popkowski (for Jill Gould) – Department of Juvenile Justice***

- Karin reported that the DJJ has evening reporting centers for youth.
- Have a 21 day JJ Citizen's Academy in the spring and fall annually. They have had 2 classes so far with 9 graduates in the first class and 30 in the second.
- The Juvenile Justice Citizen's Academy is an in-depth look at the Juvenile Justice Center and what services are offered and the process.
