I. Introduction and Approval of Minutes

Mark Pellman called the meeting to order @ 2:30.

All parties present introduced themselves.

Steve Hardt distributed the results of student surveys of clinical sites, with cover letters thanking the staff for their assistance.

Mark Pellman motioned to approve the minutes of the October 5, 2016 meetings without correction. Seconded by Linda Semones. Motion carried.

III. Reports and Discussion

Steve Hardt also displayed and reviewed the Advisory Committee's website, and showed where it contained minutes of previous meetings, viability reports, etc. This website also contains a programmatic QI effort that reviews areas (if any) where the program scored below mean on the credentialing exams.

Steve Hardt also distributed PPRS surveys to those who had not completed them earlier.

Dr. Ludwig asked for the floor and announced she will be retiring at the end of the year. She stated she has enjoyed working with the faculty and staff of the Respiratory Care program, and thanked the members of the advisory committee for their service

The Committee reviewed the program's goals and objectives. Mark Pellman made a motion to accept the goals as stated. Seconded by Todd Ringieson. Motion carried

The Respiratory Care Program is dedicated to the philosophy and goals of the college. The Respiratory Care Program is designed to offer the student planned learning experiences and to provide knowledge, skills, and promote attitudes that will culminate in successful employment of the graduate as a respiratory therapist.

I. **COMPETENCY ONE:**

Upon completion of the program, the student will demonstrate cognitive traits consistent with professional and employer expectations for respiratory therapists

II. **COMPETENCY TWO:**

Upon completion of the program, the student will demonstrate psychomotor traits consistent with professional and employer expectations for respiratory therapists.

III. **COMPETENCY THREE:**

Upon completion of the program, the student will demonstrate affective traits consistent with professional and employer expectations for respiratory therapists.

The duties of the advisory committee members were reviewed from the website.

The attached workforce data was reviewed, and Steve Hardt showed the link where this data could be obtained from the program's advisory committee website. Since there were several new advisory committee members present, Steve agreed to send everyone a link they could save to their computer desktops.

The attached data dashboard was reviewed. While recent improvements have been noted, Dr. Ludwig stated the program has an opportunity for improvement in the area of attrition. Todd Ringieson asked what the likely causes of the improvements in attrition were, and was advised that it was most likely due to faculty out of class support, and a larger number of applicants to the program leading to students entering the program with higher GPAs and more gen ed/pre req courses completed.

Student and Graduate Report

Sophomores – Sarah Gillmore reported that all was well with her class

Freshman – Jake Hoss reported all was well with his class

Graduate report – Chris Mayo reported that he was not aware of any issues.

Enrollment

A graphic was presented (attached) that showed that the program's enrollment has increased from approximately 41 in 2013 to approximately 54 to date.

Capital Equipment Update

The attached proposed capital budget was reviewed. It was agreed that the prices quoted were at least at fair market value. No suggestions for additional items were offered.

Upcoming site visit

The upcoming site visit was discussed. Steve Hardt discussed the reaccreditation process and the program's self-study. He also "introduced" the program referee, and site visitors, and reviewed the proposed schedule for the upcoming site visit. There was considerable discussion regarding the program's areas of strength and opportunities for improvement

Defunct observation requirement

As discussed in an earlier advisory committee meeting, the program will no longer require observations before applying to the program. It had been agreed that the risks and inconvenience to facilities offset any benefits to the program. This is especially true as the number of applications to the program have grown and this had lead in a substantial increase in the number of observations required.

Opportunities for improvement

The members present who deal with the program's graduates were asked if there were areas where the program's graduates could be stronger. No one offered any suggestions for improvement. Steve Hardt mentioned that when he visits clinical sites he often seeks out those charged with precepting the program's graduates, and asks them where the program could do better. He mentioned that he has received some informal feedback the graduates could be better prepared for post extubation.

During CoARC site visit, October 30, 2017 from 11:30 to 1:30. Lunch will be provided by the program.

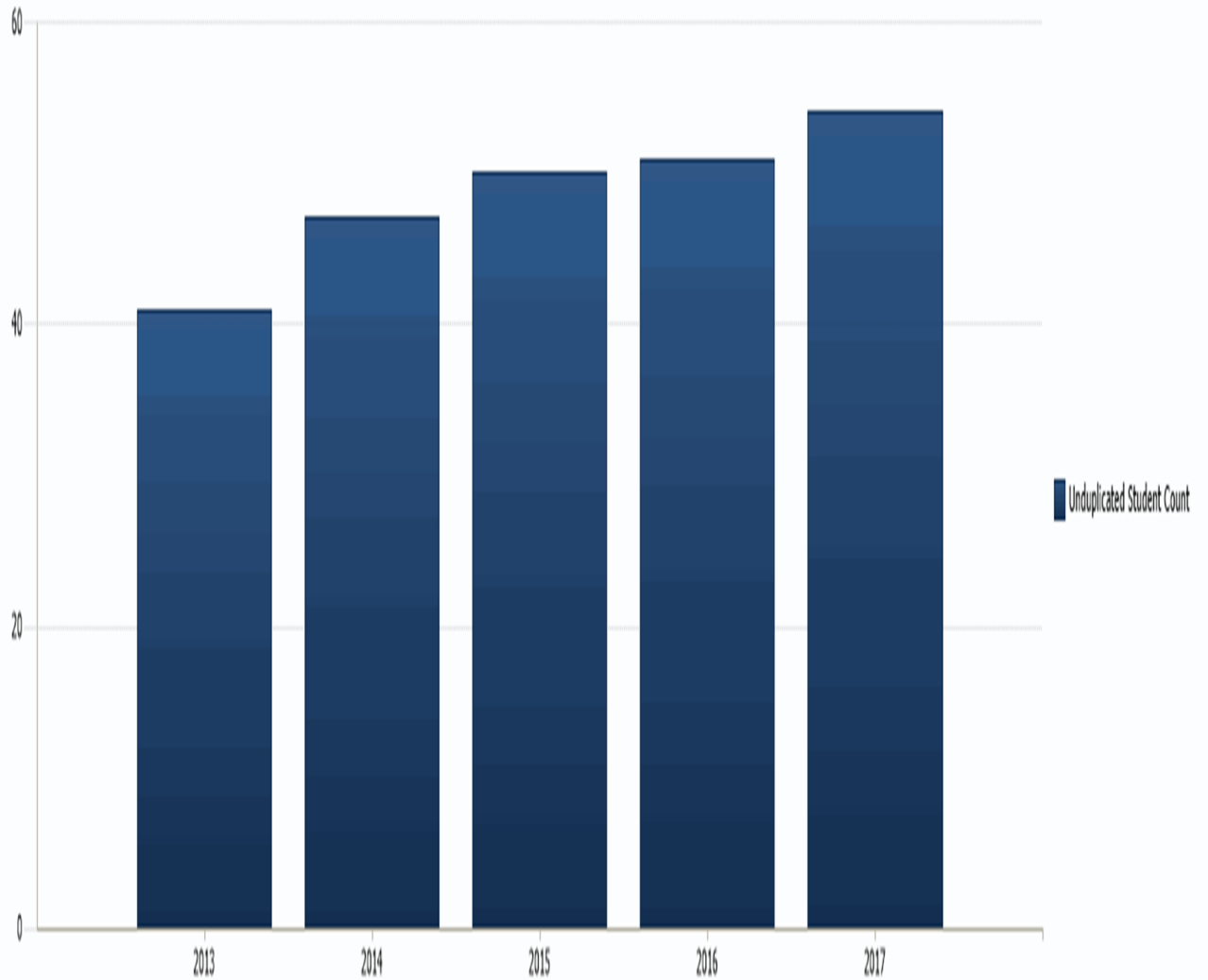
